One of the things I love, is to be the bearer of good news. And that I certainly am today.

LiturgyHelp, that wonderful resource that all liturgical ministers have grown to know and love, has had a massive MAKEOVER!!!

Patrick Nisbet, Clair Stanelos and the rest of the team have been working on this for years and the site is now ready for use. They will continue developing it, so you can expect new things to pop up from time to time.

All liturgical ministers in parishes and schools will be amazed at what the new website offers. It has the same great features with much more. Once we are migrated to the new site, enjoy exploring it and learning as you go.

- Nearly all the ritual books are there
- Check out the clipboard and how that will help you
- Test-drive the search engine. It is amazing. I searched 'Peter' and it came up with the following references: 82 from the Lectionary; 60 from Reflections; 41 music, 18 Missal, 17 Commentary, 14 Scripture, 6 Liturgical events, 2 Universal Prayer
- There are concise explanations
- Test the question mark function which gives you appropriate references for the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) and other relevant documents
- A button that will take you back to the old site if you cannot find something on the new site. For example, my much-loved weekly prayer sheet is not yet on the new site.
- The ability to prepare a 'Liturgy of the Word' for any given day selecting as much of the liturgy or as little to suit your purpose.

And still there's more.

We will organise for Patrick, and hopefully Clair, to come up soon and run a series of workshops around the diocese as we did when we first took out our diocesan and then CSO subscription.

In addition, to Patrick, Clair and all the other members of the LiturgyHelp Team we say a huge thank you. They are excited and I hope you are too.
